### ICSF 607 *Dogmatic Theology II*

This Master's level Dogmatic Theology course examines the doctrines—and their sources in Scripture and Tradition—of the Church (with Christ as its founder and head, the Holy Spirit as its soul, and the Blessed Virgin Mary as its model) and of the seven Sacraments. While the primary focus will be on divine revelation and teaching of the Church's Magisterium on these sacred mysteries attention will be devoted to currently unresolved questions in these matters.



This **tuition-based** course will be a blended class offering online instruction with only three on-campus classes required.
